The Traveling Awareness Bears have begun their process to gain recognition as a Not for Profit Organization through the state of Missouri in October 2011. The Traveling Awareness Bears became incorporated in the state of Missouri in January 2012.

Artie the Autistic Bear is in Boone and enjoying the mountain air. Autism is a neurological disorder, complex in manifestation and exhibiting a spectrum of symptoms and challenges. From <http://www.autismspeaks.org/what-autism> the Autism Speaks website there is this information: Autism statistics from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) identify around 1 in 110 American children as on the autism spectrum—a 600 percent increase in prevalence over the past two decades. Careful research shows that this increase is only partly explained by improved diagnosis and awareness. Studies also show that autism is three to four times more common among boys than girls. An estimated 1 out of 70 boys is diagnosed with autism in the United States.

While information grows, diagnoses increase. Research is ongoing. There are those who believe that Autism is an evolutionary shift in the human species to adapt to rapid change (as noted in the book, *The Asperger Plus Child* by George T. Lynn and Joanne Barrie Lynn). The strengths of Autism include a specialized focus in specific areas of interest. Celebrating every child's strengths and gifts enables society to thrive as we grow more complex and diverse. Find out more about the Traveling Awareness Bears and welcome the differences among us.
