

High Country Bike Plan Survey

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High Country Council of Governments is developing a bike plan for Yancey, Mitchell, Avery, Watauga, Ashe, Alleghany, and Wilkes Counties. The Plan is intended to improve safety, access, and mobility for cyclists by developing a network of designated routes that connect municipalities and other major destinations in the region. The Plan will identify needed improvements to existing roadways, prioritize the improvements, and develop a signage plan to mark the identified routes. As part of the planning process, a citizen survey has been developed to gather input on current cycling use, challenges, and desired improvements. The survey consists of 23 questions, and is geared towards cyclists and non-cyclists alike.
