Mabel School Counselor Christy Welch has been chosen as the Watauga County Schools Counselor of the Year for 2011-12. Her selection was welcomed by Mabel Principal Mark Hagaman, who praised Welch for “consistently going far above and beyond the requirements of her role to help students, family, and faculty members at Mabel. In addition to carrying out her considerable workload of routine duties, she has helped a number of families grieving the loss of parents, implemented the Pioneer Prom Boutique to assist less fortunate students obtain prom dresses, and established a parent resource center to provide information about coping with the challenges of parenting.
