Greene, Pioneers smash Tigers

Ethan Greene and the Watauga High football team took out their frustrations against Fred T. Foard on Friday night.

Greene, who tiurned in a career night, threw for 217 yards and four touchdowns as the Pioneers rolled over Fred T. Foard 35-6 in a Northwestern 3A/4A Conference game in Newton. The win snaps a three-game losing streak and give WHS (3-5 overall; 1-2 in the NW3A/4A) its first conference win of the year.

"Our defense was outstanding from start to finish," said WHS coach Tim Pruitt. "We controlled the issue all night long and shut down the running lanes. Offensively, we took what they gave us, and we also jumped on some things that were made available to us."

The Pioneers held Tre Robinson, Foard's (0-9; 0-4) biggest weapon, to 65 yards on 16 carries. He also cracked the 1,000-yard barrier in the second quarter. But team-wise, the Tigers only ran for 53 yards. But it was Greene, who grabbed center-stage on Friday night.

He hooked up with Mo Gore on a pair of touchdoiwn passes to ignite the offense. His 14-yard toss to Gore late in the first quarter gave WHS a 6-0 lead and put the Pioneers up to stay; his 72-yard toss to Gore with 4:07 left in the third quarter put the game away as WHS built a commanding 28-0 lead.

"It was just blown coverage on that 72-yard pass play," Pruitt said. "We were going to run a swing screen to Mo on that side, but they didn't have a cornerback in the area. I saw that and yelled to Greene, 'go-go', and it resulted in a big play for us."

The Ploneers had 237 yards of offense, but only 20 yards on the ground. Baker Stanley, a question mark health-wise for the better part of last week, was Watauga's leading ball carrier with 27 yards on four carries. His 16-yard run early in the second quarter gave WHS a 14-0 lead.

The short scoring drive was set up by a muffed punt attempt by the Tigers. Punter Sterling Cline fumbled the snap and the Pioneers pounced on it at the 16-yard-line, setting up Stanley's score.

In all, the Tigers turned it over four times. Trey Kavanaugh and Cody McKinney each had an interception. Gore finished with two catches for 86 yards and a pair of scores. Seth Sloan was on the receiving end of a 62-yard scoring pass from Greene in the second quarter, and Matt Scott made a diving grab in the end zone in the fourth quarter on a 20-yard toss to close out the scoring for WHS.

"Ethan really grew up a lot tonight," Pruitt said. "And our pass protection was pretty good for the most part, but we still had some breakdowns. But overall, I'm pleased it was a good team effort and a huge win for us with Alexander Central coming to town next week."

The Pioneers return home to celebrate Homecoming against Alexander Central next Friday night. The Cougars blasted St. Stephens 55-25 in Taylorsville Friday night. That win coupled with Hibriten defeating South Caldwell 44-7 moves Alexander Central into sole possession of

second place in the NW3A/4A Conference. The Cougars (3-0 NW3A/4A) trail Hibriten (4-0 in league play) by one-half game for that No.1 seed.
