

UPDATED: Red Tornadoes blow away WHS, 42-0

The Watauga High football team slipped, stumbled and fell Friday night at Frank Barger Stadium in Hickory.

The Hickory Red Tornadoes, who have been an up-and-down team for the better part of the year, put it all together in their match-up with the Pioneers. The end result, Hickory blasted WHS 42-0 in a Northwestern 3A/4A Conference game. The win also moves Hickory into a second-place tie with South Caldwell. The Spartans lost to Alexander Central 19-14.

It 's the second time in as many weeks that the Pioneers have been shut-out, and the third time this season. Making matters worse, the Pioneers (3-7 overall, 1-4 NW3A/4A) continued to struggle on offense, gaining just 98 yards on the night, including 14 yards on 22 plays in the first half.

“The big plays really hurt us,” said WHS coach Tim Pruitt. “They made some big plays, but it wasn’t anything we didn’t prepare for. We also made some big mistakes.”

In turn, the Red Tornadoes (4-6; 3-2), who had nearly 397 yards, including 235 on the ground,, scored on their first two possessions and took a 14-0 first-quarter lead.

T,J, Wimbush scored on a two-yard run on Hickory’s first possession for a 7-0 lead, and 94 seconds later, a turnover gave Hickory the ball at Watauga’s 19-yard line. Quarterback Kyle Johnson ran it in from 14-yards out two plays later.

Johnson hooked up with Michael Payne on a 23-yard pass scoring pass and with Jake Meade on a 33-yard strike giving Hickory a commanding 28-0 lead at the intermission and put the contest out of reach. Johnson was 9-13 for 162 yards,

“We did some good things tonight,” Pruitt said. “But we weren’t consistent enough. They were also pretty physical on defense, especially in their secondary. One missed block, or one missed assignment really hurt us. It just reared its ugly head.”

Sophomore Jordan Lockhart led the ground game for the Red Tornadoes with 134 yard on 13 carries and a touchdown. His four-yard run in the fourth quarter capped off a 15-play, 95-yard drive that gave Hickory a 35-0 advantage.

Cameron Stinson’s interception at his own five-yard line set up the long drive that took nearly 6 ½ minutes off the clock. The Pioneers turned it over three times.

The loss also leaves WHS one win shy of being playoff-eligible. A win against St. Stephens next Friday night at Jack Groce Stadium would cure that ill, and it would make WHS at least a bubble team for post-season play. WHS hasn't missed the playoffs since 2005.

“ I was proud of how the guys hung in there,” Pruitt said. “Losing Trey Kavanaugh (he had his appendix removed Sunday night) hurts, but we had some people like Brian Bolster step up. There’s no quit in this group.

“Like I told them after the game, there’s only eight teams that finish the season on a winning note, and those are the state champions. And we have a chance to finish our season on a winning note next Friday night against St. Stpehens. If it gets us in the playoffs fine, if not, at least we finished up on a positive note.”
