The match, which was to be a home match for WHS, was moved down to St. Stephens because of wintry weather in Boone. The Pioneers (10-3 overall; 7-0 in the Northwestern 3A/4A Conference) were led by Steve Lake, Micheal Smith, Harrison Battle, Patrick O'Neal, Landon Taylor, and Aaron Evans in singles play. Lake and Smith, Battle and Taylor, Evans and Jackson Yates were all victorious in doubles play. Noah Moomow and Patrick Carlson picked up victories in exhibition play.

The Pioneers return home to play Newton-Conover Thursday night. And the men's tennis team will be offering free hot dogs and lemonade to all those attending the match. Thursday's non-conference match begins at 4:30 pm at the Watauga High tennis courts.

TRACK AND BASKETBALL NEWS:

Watauga High senior Sydney Cook will sign her national letter of intent Thursday afternoon. She will attend Appalachian State next fall, where she will continue her track career. Cook, a state finalist at the indoor championships last season, was also named the Northwestern 3A/4A Conference Field Athlete of the Year last spring. A pole vaulter, Cook has jumped a career-best 11-feet, six inches this season. She accomplished that at St. Stephens on March 23. Teammate Kasey Jones, who has been hampered by a hamstring injury this season, has received an academic scholarship to attend East Tennessee State next fall. Jones, in her first competition of the season, finished second in the 100-meter high hurdles at the Fleet Feet Invitational in Claremont, NC, last Saturday. She crossed the finish line in 14.96. Meloney Ramos of North Rowan won the race in 14.92.....Junior Cameron Sealey of Lenior-Rhyne University has been named to the North Carolina Sports Information Association All-State Team. She was a second-team selection. Sealey, who averaged 18 points-per-game this past season, is also the 17th player in school history to crack the 1,000-point barrier.
