#### WHS Soccer Moves Into First Place

The Watauga High women's soccer team is flirting with its first conference championship in five years.

The Pioneers took a serious step in that direction Friday night as they knocked off Alexander Central 2-0 at Jack Groce Stadium. The win moves WHS (11-2-1 overall; 7-1-1 Northwestern 3A/4A Conference) into a first-place tie with St. Stphens in the NW3A/4A standings. Hickory defeated St. Stephens 2-1 in overtime Friday night.

"We really didn't play our best game, but we won," said WHS coach Brittany Bolick, who is making a strong run at Coach of the Year honors in the NW3A/4A. "We had some chances, but (Alexander Central) played real well defensively,"

Hannah Younger tallied the first WHS goal at the ten minute mark of the first half. Lillie Brady picked up the assist. The Pioneers added an insurance tally when Skylar Hicks scored at the 61-minute mark of the second half on an assist by Austin Mauney. The win sets up a huge week for the Pioneers.

WHS, which hasn't won a conference championship since 2006 when Doug Kidd was head coach, travels to Hickory on Tuesday and St. Stephens on Thursday. The Pioneers split their first two games against those teams. They beat Hickory 2-1 March 25, but dropped a 4-1 decision to the Indians on March 29.

The WHS JV team defeated Alexander Central, 6-0. Hali Wood-Miller had two goals; Carrigan Doble had three assists; Eliza Enterline had a goal and an assist. Liz Clarke and Marcie Mahoney scored the other WHS goals. The Cougars also gave up an own goal in the loss.

Pudney suffered the loss. She faced two batters in the fourth before she departed. Pudney gave up two runs on six hits. She walked two and struck out two. Robinson finished up.

The Pioneers entertain Hickory on Tuesday; St. Stephens comes to town on Thursday for Senior Night, and the Pioneers will play East Wilkes in a double-header on Holy Saturday at the Sports Colmplex to close out the week. The East Wilkes game is a make up for games that were rained out on March 9 and April 7.
