

## **WHS Soccer Falls, 3-0**

A tough week came to an end for the Watauga High women's soccer team.

The Pioneers (11-4-1 overall; 7-3-1 Northwestern 3A/4A Conference), who began the week in a first-place tie with St. Stephens in the NW3A/4A Conference standings, now find themselves two games off the pace with a game left in the regular season. The Indians nailed down the regular-season title by blanking WHS 3-0 Thursday night down in St. Stephens.

The Indians broke the game open with a pair of goals in the final 12 minutes of the second half. "It was just a tough week," said WHS coach Brittany Bolick. "Hopefully, having the week off will give us a chance to regroup."

WHS did win the JV game. The Pioneers defeated St. Stephens 5-1, thanks to Marcie Mahoney, who tallied three times. Hali Wood-Miller had three assists. Carrigan Dale and Kat Welch had the other WHS goals.

## **WHS SOFTBALL:**

The Watauga High softball team was victimized by an excellent pitching performance on Thursday afternoon.

Katie Baker of St. Stephens scattered five hits and struck out nine as the Indians bested WHS 8-1 at the Sports Complex. The win will also cost WHS its first winning conference season record since 1996. Kim Robinson drove in Watauga's (6-9 overall; 5-6 in the Northwestern 3A/4A Conference) only run in the fourth inning. Taylor Drummonds had two hits.

And we have a correction to pass along. And a big thanks as well to Jerry Moretz, Mike Steele, Brian Vannoy and Tori Greene for this valuable information. Thanks to those folks, we have discovered that the Pioneers have produced one winning conference record in fast-pitch softball. And they did it during the first season of competition, in the spring of 1996.

Ironically, Moretz was the head coach. He replaced Margaret Dreibelbis, who resigned the year before. The Pioneers were 14-10 overall and 7-5 in the old Northwestern 4A Conference. Their only losses that year in league play came against Alexander Central and Crest (twice each), and Freedom.

"Our pitching wasn't very good that year, but we sure outscored a lot of people," Moretz said.
