

Turner Stands Tall in Region 7 Loss

The Region 7 All-Stars came up short in the opening round of the North Carolina State games at Wake Forest University Thursday night. Region 7 only made five hits and dropped a 4-3 decision to Region 5. Max Linville, Matt Proffitt and Ryan Turner of the Watauga High baseball team are playing for Region 7. Turner had the best night of the three in the loss.

Turner, who had a stellar junior year for the Pioneers, was 1-2, reached on an error, had two stolen bases and scored a run.

"Ryan really looked good," said Starmount coach Mike McCann, who is coaching the Region 7 team. "He was the only real bright spot for us offensively tonight."

She had an effort of 10-feet, 5 1/2 inches; Laura Gulliver of the Pioneers competed, but did not place (no height). Chelsea Vaughn of New Jersey won the event as she cleared the bar at 12-3 1/4.
