WHS VOLLEYBALL DROPS THIRD STRAIGHT

It's very rare to see the Watauga High volleyball team mired in a three-game losing streak. But that's the situation the Pioneers (11-5 overall; 6-1 Northwestern 3A/4A Conference) find themselves in at the moment. The Pioneers dropped their third consecutive match at home Tuesday night in a 3-1 loss to St. Stephens. And the loss was a costly one as the Pioneers now find themselves in a first-place tie with the Indians in the NW3A/4A Conference standings. The Indians, who dropped the opening set 23-25, came charging back to win the next three games and won the match. A 27-25 win in the third game gave Saint a 2-1 lead, and the Indians put it away by winning the fourth game, 25-21.

The Indians were led by Jenna Boliek with 14 kills and 12 digs, Brenna Hall 12 kills and three blocks, Marisa Jones six kills, Ashley Markland 25 digs, Jodi Kerley 11 digs, Katelyn Houser 21 assists and 11 digs and Bailey Cloninger 15 assists and nine digs. The Indians (6-1) played inspired volleyball after the death of former classmate Evan Ford on Monday. Ford had been struck with leukemia. The team wore orange ribbons in their hair in his memory.

Kristen Carter led WHS with 48 assists in the loss; Channing Hagaman had 20 kills and 21 digs; Kierston McClannon had ten kills and 16 digs.

The Pioneers entertain West Iredell in a non-conference match tonight at Lentz-Eggers Gym. The JV team (10-2; 6-1) dropped a 2-1 decision to St. Stephens. The Indians won the third and decisive game, 25-17. Sarah Combs paced WHS with 19 assists and nine digs.
