

Strong Second Half Lifts LMC Women Over Falcons

The Lees-McRae College women's soccer team scored four goals in the second half, including a strike from LeeAnn Sullivan (Greensboro, N.C.), en route to a pivotal 5-0 win over Pfeiffer University in Conference Carolinas play as the

Bobcats celebrated Homecoming Weekend on Saturday afternoon at Tate Field. Lees-McRae (7-3-1, 6-1 CC) outshot Pfeiffer (5-6, 4-2 CC) by a 16-4 margin on the afternoon, controlling the run of play from the first whistle as the Bobcats held an 8-2 advantage in attempts at goal in each half. Freshman Erica Allen (Norton, Ohio) paced the Bobcats with two goals and one assist, while fellow rookie Sarah Mahar (Jacksonville, Fla.) tallied one goal and one helper in the contest.

LeeAnn Sullivan and twin sister MaryBeth Sullivan (Greensboro, N.C.) each found the back of the net for Lees-McRae, as Mallory Overholt (Grand Bend, Ontario, Canada) added an assist. Kaitlyn Briggs (Oviedo, Fla.) made three saves to keep the 11th clean sheet of her career. Aaliyah Jackson paced Pfeiffer with two shots, both on frame, as Brittany Polly made seven saves in 72 minutes of work. Bianca Moeller and Kori Holland combined to serve the final 18 minutes between the pipes for the Falcons.

The match remained scoreless until the early moments of the 44th minute, when Allen flicked a deft finish into the left side of the net from 10 yards out, sending the Bobcats into the interval with a 1-0 advantage.

LeeAnn Sullivan doubled the advantage to 2-0 less than a minute into the second half, slotting the finish into the bottom right corner for her first goal of the season. MaryBeth Sullivan found her way onto the score sheet in the 69th minute, taking a cross from Overholt and sending a brilliant finish into the far corner to give the Bobcats a 3-0 lead.

Allen tallied her first career brace in the closing stages of the 78th minute, finding the back of the net after a skillful buildup from Mahar to push the advantage to four. The Norton, Ohio native returned the favor midway through the 87th minute, setting up Mahar for the finish from six yards out to cap the afternoon's scoring.

Lees-McRae returns to the pitch on Wednesday when the Bobcats host Limestone College in a pivotal conference clash at 5 p.m. on Tate Field.

Bobcats Play To Scoreless Draw With Falcons

The Lees-McRae College men's soccer team and Pfeiffer University played to a scoreless draw on Saturday evening in Conference Carolinas play on Tate Field, needing 110 minutes to each earn a result in a physical and tightly contested battle.

Lees-McRae (3-8-1, 2-3-1 CC) dominated possession and peppered the Pfeiffer (0-10-2, 0-5-1 CC) goal with a seemingly endless barrage of shots, outshooting the Falcons by a 38-8 margin, including a 20-3 advantage in the second half. The Bobcats held a 10-4 edge in corner kicks on the night, as junior Thomas Rusling (Sheffield, England) made three saves to record his 13th career shutout.

Junior James Galvani (High Wycombe, England) paced the Bobcats with a career-high 12 shots, as Preston Shahdad (Charlotte, N.C.) took six attempts at goal. James Smith (Eastbourne, England) and Scott Alford (Hillsborough, N.C.) each tallied five shots on the day. Cristian Padilla and Zach Liles combined to stop 12 shots for the Falcons, as Liles came on following the interval and logged the final 65 minutes, making 10 saves. Dale Ashford paced the Falcons with two shots, including one on frame.

The Bobcats came out firing from the first whistle, launching 12 shots at goal in the first half as Galvani nearly provided the breakthrough with a pair of glorious chances in the opening 15 minutes, including a headed effort in the 14th that sailed just wide of the woodwork.

John Williams (Rutherfordton, N.C.) and Galvani forced Padilla to preserve the deadlock with a pair of brilliant shots in the 28th minute, before Smith nearly gave the Bobcats an early advantage in the 37th when his driven shot wrung the bar from distance.

The Bobcats continued to press the attack in the second half, sending 20 shots toward goal in the period, including a quartet of Galvani efforts in the opening 20 minutes that sailed just wide of the post. Alford nearly provided the breakthrough in the 68th minute, nodding a free header inches right of the woodwork.

Liles made perhaps the save of the evening in the 75th minute, denying a well-struck effort by Galvani from the penalty spot after the Falcons were called for a hand ball off a corner kick. The Falcon keeper made a trio of key stops over the final 15 minutes of regulation, preserving the deadlock and sending the match to extra time as a pair of driven efforts from Shahdad and Galvani sailed just wide of the woodwork from distance.

The Bobcat attack continued to push forward in search of a winner in extra time, outshooting the Falcons by a 6-1 margin in the additional 20 minutes while forcing Liles to make four skillful stops. Freshman Matthew Cureton (Waxhaw, N.C.) nearly delivered the winner twice within a minute in the second extra time period, sending a pair of magnificent efforts just wide as Shahdad and TC Stephens (Fuquay-Varina, N.C.) forced two saves by Liles in the waning moments.

Lees-McRae returns to the pitch on Wednesday when the Bobcats host Limestone College in a pivotal conference matchup at 7 p.m. on Tate Field.
