PIONEERS DOWN HIBRITEN IN GIRL'S SOCCER

The Watauga High girl's soccer team wiped out an early 1-0 deficit and defeated Hibriten 3-2 Friday night at Storie Stadium in Lenior, N.C., in a Northwestern 3A/4A Conference game. Hannah Younger's unassisted goal in the 69th minute of the second half gave WHS a 2-1 lead. Sierra Hill's unassisted goal in the 75th minutes gave WHS some insurance and a commanding 3-1 lead. Maddie Critcher tied the game with a goal in the 65th minute of the second half on a feed from Derrick Hannah that tied the game. Following that game-tying goal by Critcher, the Pioneers (3-2-2 overall; 2-0-1 NW3A/4A) erupted. They scored three goals in a ten-minute span.

The Pioneers have a demanding week coming up. They travel to St. Stephens Tuesday night, they play at McDowell on Wednesday and they're scheduled to play Fred T. Foard at home next Thursday night in their final game before the Easter Holiday break.

PANTHERS RALLY TO BEAT PIONEERS

The woes continue for the Watauga High softball team. The Pioneers suffered a tough loss Friday night as Hibriten rallied from an early 5-2 deficit and beat the Pioneers 6-5 in eight innings in Lenior, N.C., in a Northwestern 3A/4A Conference game.

Kim Robinson suffered the loss in relief. The Pioneers (3-5 overall; 1-4 NW3A/4A) have lost four in a row. Robinson backboned WHS offensively with a double and a home run. The Pioneers made seven hits, but they also committed three errors. Megan Jackson had a double in the losing cause. Hibriten made four errors.

WHS grabbed an early 3-0 lead in the first inning. It was 5-2 going into the bottom of the fifth. But the Panthers started their rally with a run in the bottom of the fifth, and they tied the game with two more runs in the bottom of the sixth.
