

Indians Nip Pioneers On Huffman's Double

It's been a tough season to say the least for the Watauga High softball team, but head coach Stephanie Kostis is taking a positive approach to remedy the situation.

The Pioneers (5-10 overall; 2-10 in the Northwestern 3A/4A Conference) dropped a 2-1 decision against St. Stephens at the WHS Softball Complex on Senior Night Friday. Mollie Huffman's run-scoring double in the top of the seventh drove in the eventual winning run. The Pioneers had a chance in the bottom of the seventh. They had a runner at first with two outs, but senior Riley Pudney grounded out to third to end the game.

"That snake has been sitting on us all year," Kostis said. "But tonight, even though we lost, I finally saw the team I come to know. Riley was the player I wanted up there in that situation. We gave a great effort tonight. And I'm hoping this will kick start our season when the tournament begins (on Tuesday). After all, it's a new season."

The Pioneers, a No.6 seed, will play at South Caldwell Tuesday. Senior Bailey Partin drove in WHS' only run in the top of the first with an RBI single. Taylor Drummonds singled, stole second and advanced to third on a wild pitch. The Pioneers didn't score again.

The Indians tied the game at 1-1 with a run in the sixth. Drummonds paced WHS with three hits. The Pioneers out hit the Indians, 6-5. Kim Robinson suffered the loss. The WHS senior had one of her best outings of the year. She had 11 strikeouts. Bujt a two-out walk in the seventh opened the door for St. Stephens.

"It's been a disappointing season for our seniors," Kostis said. "But we still have a chance to redeem ourselves. The girls are pretty pumped up about tonight's game, and they're excited about getting to practice on Monday. All we can do from this point on is to look forward."

The Spartans swept WHS during the regular season, and dating back to last season, South Caldwell has beaten WHS three consecutive times. South Caldwell eliminated WHS in the opening round of the NW3A/4A Tournament last season. Tuesday's first-round game in Sawmills, N.C., begins at 5:30 p.m. The winner plays Hickory or Fred T. Foard in the semifinals Thursday at Alexander Central at 6:30 p.m.
