

## Pioneers Upended By Schubert Again

The Watauga High softball team had a much better showing against Lexi Schubert and Fred T. Foard in their third and final meeting of the season. Unfortunately, Schubert, who tossed a perfect game against WHS (6-12) in their last meeting (by a 16-0 score on April 24), bested the Pioneers again with a 3-1 win Thursday in the semifinal round of the Northwestern 3A/4A Conference Tournament in Taylorsville, N.C.

The Tigers, the No.2 seed in the NW3A/4A Tournament and the No.1 team in the state in Class 3A, advance to the finals for the second year in a row. They will play Alexander Central in the finals Friday night at 6 p.m. The Cougars, the No.1 seed and the No.1 team in the state in Class 4A, advanced to the finals by knocking off St. Stephens 7-1 in Thursday's first semifinal game. The Pioneers, the No.6 seed, was looking for its second upset win in three days. And WHS, which upended South Caldwell Tuesday night, grabbed a 1-0 lead in the first inning.

Senior Taylor Drummonds, who was 1-2 with a run scored and a stolen base, walked with one out, stole second base, and scored on Hope LaPointe's RBI double. But from that point on, Shubert was in complete control. She struck out 12 and did not walk a batter after she gave Drummonds a free pass in the first inning.

Shubert retired 12 of the next 14 batters she faced. The only WHS players to reach base during that stretch were Drummonds, who singled in the third and was thrown out trying to steal, and Caitlin Westphal, who was hit by a pitch.

Losing pitcher Kim Robinson nearly matched Shubert on the mound. Robinson, a senior, who has struggled with her control all season, gave up three runs, one earned, on four hits, she struck out ten and walked three in six innings. The third inning proved to be her downfall.

Addie Bolick walked and scored all the way from first base on an Erynne Chalk single that was misplayed in the outfield. That tied the game, 1-1. And Chalk scored moments later on Shubert's double for a 2-1 lead. Schubert helped her own cause with two hits on the night.

The WHS baseball team plays South Caldwell in the semifinal round of the NW3A/4A Tournament today at 4:30 p.m. at MSDeal Stadium in Granite Falls, N.C. Coverage begins at 4 p.m. on Classic Hits 100.7 FM.
