
The Watauga High baseball team pulled one out in dramatic fashion on Monday night as the Pioneers fought back from a 7-3 deficit and beat Alexander Central 12-8 down in Taylorsville to maintain its grip on first place in the Northwestern 4A Conference.


Kyle Miller, who came on as a pinch-hitter in the third inning, had a career night as he backboned the attack with a double, a grand slam and six runs-batted-in. His grand slam home run in the fifth inning tied the game at 7, and the Pioneers (8-2 overall; 5-1 NW4A) waltzed home from there. A four-run explosion in the sixth inning highlighted by Cal Hardee's seeing-eye single up the middle against a drawn-in infield, and Chris Shelton's two-run single gave WHS an 11-7 lead. Jon Sharpe, who came on in relief of Hardee in the third, picked up his third win of the year. The right-hander gave up an unearned run on seven hits, walked one and struck out five. The Pioneers are on a roll. They've won five in a row.

South Caldwell and McDowell kept pace, however. The Spartans scored five times in the top of the seventh and beat A.C. Reynolds, 6-2 down in Asheville. And McDowell scored all of its runs in the second inning as the Titans blasted Freedom, 13-2. South Caldwell wraps-up first-half play in the NW4A tonight in Taylorsville against Alexander Central; and McDowell wraps up the first half of the conference season at home against A.C. Reynolds. The Pioneers travel to South Caldwell on Friday. McDowell comes to Boone next Thursday night.
