

WHS baseball captures first place; sports round-up for Friday, April 10, 2009

The Watuaga High baseball team took over sole possession of first place in the Northwestern 4A Conference as the Pioneers (10-3 overall; 7-1 NW4A) rallied to beat McDowell, 6-2 at WHS-Field on Thursday night.

Winning pitcher Jon Shape turned in a stellar effort as the right-hander gave up one earned run, scattered six hits, walked one and struck out nine. Sharpe also did a great job working around three WHS errors in the first inning that handed McDowell (10-3; 6-2) an early 1-0 lead by striking out the side.

The heroes were many. Trey Lowder had his best game of the year offensively and he went 3-3 with two doubles, a single, a run scored and an run-batted-in. Adam Church ignited a four-run rally in the fifth as he belted a two-run homer, his fourth of the year, snapping a 2-2 tie and putting WHS on top to stay.

David Martin had two hits and scored a run; Phil Gordon had a single and drove in two runs; Cal Hardee had a hit; Chris Shelton drove in a run, and Baine Martin walked and scored on Church's home run in the fifth.

The loss drops McDowell into a two-way tie with South Caldwell for second place. But the Spartans own the tie breaker because they've beaten McDowell this season.

The JV team won 14-1 in 4 ½ innings. The game was called because of the ten-run mercy rule.

The Pioneers travel to Clemmons to play a non-conference game at West Forsyth on Saturday. JV game at noon; the varsity at 2 pm. Then it's off to Cary for the Impact Spring Classic on Monday and Tuesday at the U.S. Olympic facility.

The Pioneers will play Ragsdale, which is ranked third in the state in Class 3A on Monday at 1:30 pm; and then they play South Central at 4 pm that afternoon. WHS wraps up tournament play with one game on Tuesday. There will be no radio coverage for any of these games (Saturday, Monday and Tuesday), but we will have updates on our morning sports reports on WATA.
