The Mountaineers (19-16) apparently like doing things the hard way. They spotted Gardner-Webb an early 4-0 lead before they came charging back to win, 12-10 in a non-conference game at Smith Stadium/Beaver Field. Isaac Harrow was one of the many heroes for the Apps as he hit a home run and knocked in four runs. Jerod Faggart had a home run and knocked in three runs; Chris Alessandria had two hits and two runs-batted-in, and Wes Hobson went 4-5 with an RBI. He also raised his batting average to .395. The Apps travel to Charleston to play the College of Charleston this weekend. They open the series with a 6 pm game on Friday. They will play 1 pm games on Saturday and Sunday.
