WMYA-TV (Channel 40) in Asheville, NC will televise the game. WMYA reaches 900,000 homes in western North Carolina and upstate South Carolina. Kick-off remains the same at 3:30 pm.

Gardin-Johnson, a track and field star (1988-92), who won ten Southern Conference championships, was an All-Southern Conference selection eight times and won All-American recognition in 1989; two-time first-team All-American Corey Hall, who played football for the Apps from 1997-2000; two-time first-team consensus All-American Josh Jeffries, who starred for the Apps on the grid-iron from 1999-2002; punter Mark Royals, who played for eight different teams in 16 NFL seasons. He also led the NFL in punting with a 45.9 per-yard-average as a member of the New Orleans Saints in 1997; and basketball star Tyson Patterson, who backboned ASU to an NCAA tournament appearance in 1999-2000. ASU was 79-37, including a 47-14 Socon mark during his four-year stay with the Mountaineers. He also led the Apps in steals and assists for three consecutive years. F.P. "Bodie" Bodenheimer, Jr., a long-time supporter of ASU athletics will receive the 2009 Special Service Award.
