

Pioneers fall to Southern Wayne

The Watauga High baseball team suffered its third consecutive loss in the opening round of the Winterville Baseball Bash Saturday afternoon in Winterville, NC.

The Pioneers (8-6), who coughed up three runs in the top of the first inning, battled back, lost 7-5 to Southern Wayne in the opening round. The Pioneers, taking advantage of three Southern Wayne errors, pulled into a 3-3 tie by the third inning.
