

Global warming recommendations heard

The North Carolina Climate Action Plan Advisory Group presented 56 recommendations to the state Legislature yesterday on how to develop a global warming plan to reduce greenhouse gasses.

Those recommendations include improving the efficiency of government buildings and cutting automobile tailpipe emissions. Adopting all of the recommendations, the panel said, would return the state to 1990 levels of greenhouse gas emissions within 13 years, reducing projected emissions to nearly half what they would be if no action is taken. A final report will be submitted to lawmakers by the end of the year.
