Boone, Rutherford SO, Charge Boone Teen

Boone Police and the Rutherford County Sheriff's Office worked together to make the arrest of a Boone man on numerous felony charges this week. The charges stem from crimes committed in both Boone and Forest City, according to the police release, which says that on July 17th, Boone Police discovered that convicted felon Timothy James Patrick McQueen had sold a firearm to a local pawnshops. McQueen, 19, of North Street in Boone, was interviewed, the investigation revealing that a firearm, coins, and gold jewelry were stolen from a family member in Forest City and then sold to the Boone pawnshop. On July 25th, Boone Police arrested McQueen, charging him with one count of Felony Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, one count of Felony Possession of a Stolen Firearm and one count of Felony Obtaining Property by False Pretense. Boone Police also served warrants from Rutherford County on Mr. McQueen charging him with one count of Felony Breaking and Entering, one count of Felony Safecracking, one count of Felony Larceny after Breaking and Entering, one count of Felony Larceny of a Firearm and one count of Felony Possession of a Firearm by a Felon. Mr. McQueen was taken before a Watauga County Magistrate and assigned court dates of September 8th for the Rutherford County charges and September 17th, for the Boone Charges. The teen was placed under a secured bond of \$45,000.
