

Ashe Trio Charged in Watauga Drug Counts

A traffic stop September 1st led Narcotics Detectives from the Watauga County Sheriff's Office to arrest two Todd women and a Lansing man in a vehicle stop after they are reported to have purchased precursors commonly used to manufacture methamphetamine. Carol Renee Main, 43, and Kimberly Walker Greer, 50, both of 8529 Three Top Road, Todd, were charged with Conspiracy to Manufacture Methamphetamine and Possession of Meth Precursors, Greer also charged with Possession of Marijuana. Main was taken to the Watauga County Detention Facility where she was held under a \$27,700 secured bond, with Main having additional warrants from Ashe County that she was served with for Possession of Marijuana and Drug Paraphernalia. Greer was taken to the Watauga County Detention Facility where she was set a \$25,000 secured bond.

Sean Mark Stamper, 28, of 395 Phoenix Drive, Lansing, was charged with Conspiracy to Manufacture Methamphetamine, Possession of Methamphetamine Precursors, and Fictitious Information to an Officer. Stamper was taken to the Watauga County Detention Facility where he was held under a \$27,000 secured bond. Stamper had original warrants from Ashe County that he was served with for Driving while License Revoked. Sheriff Len Hagaman said, "We have made a significant impact on preventing methamphetamine production at its core. Meth cooks can't produce methamphetamine without pseudoephedrine. By combating the items used to manufacture methamphetamine, we have cut down on meth production."
