They followed that up by knocking off Hibriten 7-6 Friday afternoon in Boone. The Pioneers wiped out a 5-1, fourth-inning deficit. Senior Tori Wright highlighted the comeback with a two-run single in the frame. The Panthers picked up a run in the sixth and led 6-5 going into the bottom of the seventh. But a run-scoring single by Robinson tied the game, and Shelby Winebarger's RBI single plated the game winner.

"I'm not at all surprised by what this team has done," said WHS coach Stephanie Long. "We worked real hard on fundamentals during the off-season, and that's made us a very competitive team. We've really held our own in conference play"
