PIONEERS FINISH UP AT NATIONALS

The Watauga High women's track team wrapped things up at the New Balance Nationals Saturday morning.

Rising senior Hannah Barbour turned in a 33rd-place finish in the 2,000-meter steeplechase at North Carolina A&T University in Greensboro. She completed the course in 8:22.66. Mary Kate Anselmini of Stony Brook, NY won the event with an effort of 6:34.69.

Barbour was one of four place finishers for the Pioneers at Nationals. Sydney Cook led the way finishing in a four-way tie for second place in the high jump (Emerging Elite Division) Friday night. Cook, a two-time Northwestern 3A/4A Conference Field Performer of the Year, had an effort of 5-feet, 4 1/2 inches. The 4x800 relay team (Hailey Middlebrook, Darby Middlebrook, Julia Roberts and Barbour) were 16th in Friday night's Championship Segment race.

They turned in a time of 9:27.28, which was six seconds slower than their time of 9:21.27 at the Class 4A state track meet at the same facility on May 15. The Bronxville Track Club of New York won the race in 8:49.85, setting a new meet record (8:51.60 in 2001) and falling just six-seconds shy of the national record (8:43.12 in 2008 set by Eleanor Roosevelt High School in Maryland). Debra Dommermuth finished in a three-way tie for 25th in the pole vault (Emerging Elite Division) as she cleared the bar with a jump of 10-5 1/2.
