

## Another No-Decision For Bumgarner

One step forward, one step back.

That best describes Madison Bumgarner's season with the San Francisco Giants. Every time it looks like Bumgarner will turn the corner, he's fall back a step. Case in point, Wednesday night's game against the San Diego Padres at AT&T Park.

The Giants rallied---thanks to a pair of home runs by Nate Schierholtz---to beat San Deigo 6-5 in 14 innings. Bumgarner was long gone by then. The lefthander, who is 4-9 with a 3.87 earned-run-average, coughed up five earned runs on nine hits in six innings. He walked one and struck out six.

Schierholtz, who had his the first two-homer game of his career, led off the 14th inning with his game-winning blast. The win snapped a three-game losing streak, and keeps the Giants (49-39) in first place in the National League West. They won a two-game lead on Arizona. Bumgarner next scheduled start comes against San Diego following the all-star break on July 14 at PETCO Park.
