

Hauck Earns Scholar All-American Honors

Lenoir-Rhyne's Catherine Hauck (Lake Mary, Fla.) has been named to the 2011 NSCAA Women's College Scholar

All-America Second Team. NSCAA is the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. Hauck, a senior defender from Lake Mary, Fla., just finished her collegiate career as one of the best women's soccer players in school history.

This past season, Hauck was named an NCAA Division II First-Team All-American (Daktronics) for the second straight year and led Lenoir-Rhyne to its second consecutive South Atlantic Conference Regular Season Championship including first outright.

Hauck finished second on the team in goals (11) and points scored (26) as the Bears fashioned a 17-3-1 record (a perfect 9-0 mark in league play) and advanced to the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Championship this fall.

Hauck, the Player Of The Year in both the South Atlantic Conference (2010-11) and Southeast Region (2011), also guided the Bears to their best season ever as a junior in 2010.

That squad finished 19-2-2 on the year and won both the league conference and regular season championships for the first time ever while qualifying for the national quarterfinals. The Bears also ended the season ranked No. 8 nationally in 2010.

Hauck, a four-time all-conference and all-region honoree (2008-11), is fourth on Lenoir-Rhyne's all-time list for goals with 31 to go along with 70 total points.

Hauck carries a 3.51 grade point average while majoring in health and exercise science and is a member of the South Atlantic Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.

The scholar athletes will be recognized at the annual All-America Luncheon, to be held in the Kansas City Convention Center's Grand Ballroom on Saturday, January 14, in conjunction with the 2012 NSCAA Convention in Kansas City, Mo.
