

Speir Inks 15 on National Signing Day

Western Carolina head football coach Mark Speir today announced the signing of 15 student-athletes to National Letters of Intent to play football for the Catamounts beginning in the fall of 2012. All told, Speir and the Catamounts currently have 17 in this year's incoming class with

two players - junior transfer Eddie Sullivan and incoming freshman Michael Helms, both quarterbacks - enrolling at WCU for the spring semester in early January.

Sullivan is the only upper classman brought in by Speir and his inaugural staff with the remaining 16 all coming straight out of high school. Ten of those incoming players are from the state of North Carolina with the remaining seven coming from out of state including three from Georgia, two from South Carolina, and one apiece from Florida and Texas.

"We were able to address some immediate needs on our football team with the change in staff and schemes with this year's incoming class. We have added some quality young men who are great student-athletes and will be excellent representatives of Western Carolina University both on and off the field," said Speir on Wednesday afternoon. "We are excited about the future of Catamount football."

Looking at the class as a whole, 12 of the 17 players brought in are on offense with five on defense. A combined six will play on either the offensive or defensive line with six initially listed as "quarterback/athlete."

"With the adjustment to the spread offense scheme, the quarterback position is paramount - both as a runner and a passer. In this offense, you need to have two-or-three quarterbacks with what we ask that position to do," explained Speir. "We've brought in six quarterback athletes with this incoming class. The ones that aren't calling signals will be great players at other positions on our team because of their overall athleticism."

He added, "We were also able to fulfill some needs along the offensive line with players that are athletic, while also adding a big, strong receiver in 6-4, Spearman Robinson, to be a big target and a `Barry Saunders'-type of running back in Darius Ramsey."

On the defensive side of the ball, initially the five players include a pair of defensive ends, two in the secondary and a linebacker.

"Our goal on defense was to find a smaller, but more athletic defensive end that will help us get pressure on the opposing quarterbacks. We also supplemented our secondary and the middle of our defense with some skilled athletes," said Speir.

Western Carolina Football and the Catamount Club will host a National Signing Day reception in conjunction with the Catamounts' home men's basketball game on Thursday, Feb. 2 on-campus in Cullowhee. The event will be held in the first floor Hospitality Room in the Ramsey Center prior to WCU's Southern Conference North Division showdown with the Chattanooga Mocs. Fans are encouraged to wear white to Thursday night's game in support of the annual "White Out" game.

The event, which is open to the public, will begin at 5:30 pm and will include light refreshments. Speir and his staff will be on hand to talk about this year's incoming class and will also feature video highlights of each signee.

As per NCAA rules, prospective recruits (ninth grade and up as well as individuals enrolled at

two-year schools), signees and family members of prospects or signees are not permitted to attend this event.

The Catamount football team is scheduled to open its annual spring drills on Monday, March 12 with the NCAA-mandated 15 practices to be spread over five weeks. Practice will culminate with a spring event on Saturday, April 14 in Cullowhee.
