

Pioneers Moving Monday's Game To Mocksville

Watauga High baseball coach Pete Hardee has announced that Monday's baseball game between the Pioneers and Davie County, originally scheduled to be played in Boone, has been moved to Mocksville. GARLOW VERBALLY COMMITS

Hickory High senior Ryan Garlow, who handcuffed Watauga Friday night at LP Fran Stadium in Hickory, has made a verbal commitment to play college baseball at Charleston Southern University in Charleston, S.C., next season. Charleston Southern is a Division I school and member of the Big South Conference.

Garlow (2-0) scattered four hits and struck out five Friday night as the Red Tornadoes (6-0 overall; 1-0 Northwestern 3A/4A Conference) defeated WHS, 3-0. Garlow, a left hander, had a no-hitter for 4 2/3 innings before Ethan Critcher of the Pioneers broke it up with a sharp single up the middle. The Red Tornadoes take on Alexander Central (1-4; 0-2) Tuesday night at home.
