

WHS Softball Wins Third Straight

The Watauga High softball team defeated Hibriten 15-11 Friday night in a Northwestern 3A/4A Conference game at the Sports Complex. The Pioneers (6-4 overall; 3-2 NW3A/4A), who have won three in a row and six of their last seven games, blew an early 4-0 lead, fell behind 10-9, and following a 45-minute

lightning delay, bounced back to win the game. The Pioneers stormed back with a six-run explosion in the sixth inning.

Taylor Drummonds led the way by scoring five runs. She had three singles, walked twice, she had three stolen bases and drove in a run. Riley Pudney doubled and drove in four runs.
