The Watauga High baseball team dropped a 10-4 decision to Providence on Saturday afternoon in Charlotte. Senior Max Linnville paced the Pioneers offensively. He had three hits on Saturday, scored twice and he homered. Linnville has been one of WHS's hottest hitters of late. He was batting .400 going into Saturday's matchup against Providence. The Pioneers (5-5 overall) travel to St. Stephens for a Northwestern 3A/4A Conference game Tuesday night. The right hander, Ethan Greene, will be on the mound. The Indians, who were rained out at home against Hickory, play the Red Tornadoes in a make-up game Monday night.
