

Curry Expected Back in 3-4 Months

Former All-America Stephen Curry of the Golden State Warriors had successful surgery done on his troublesome right ankle on April 25. The ankle kept Curry in and out of the line up all season. According to doctors, Curry should be back at full strength in three to four months. He only played in 26 games last

season and scored a career low 14.7 points-per-game with 5.3 assists and three rebounds an outing. The last game he played in this season was against Dallas on March 10.

HINSON TEARING IT UP IN CLASS A BALL

Former A.C. Reynolds standout John Hinson is batting .429 for the Lexington (KY) Legends of the South Atlantic League. He went 3-3 with a home run Saturday against the Savannah Sand Gnats. Hinson, who led ACR to 46 wins in 2006 and 2007 and a conference title in 2006, played at Clemson, where he batted .328 in two seasons with the Tigers (he took a red-shirt year in 2009 because of a back injury). Hinson was taken in the 13th round of the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft last season. Hinson was selected by the Philadelphia Phillies in 2007 (40th round) and again in 2010 (13th round), but he elected to stay in school.
