

Bumgarner Comes Away Empty

Madison Bumgarner pitched well enough to win Tuesday night against the New York Mets. But the left hander was well gone when the issue was settled. The San Francisco Giants rallied from a 6-4 deficit with two runs in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game. But the Mets prevailed 8-7 in ten innings. Bumgarner put up some great numbers, despite the

San Francisco loss. He went six inning, gave up two earned runs on six hits with two walks and nine strikeouts. On the year, Bumgarner is 11-6 with a 3.09 earned-run-average with 130 strikeouts in 142.2 innings pitched.

The Giants (55-47, .539 winning percentage), who were swept by the Los Angeles Dodgers this past weekend, remain one percentage point in front of the Dodgers (56-48, .538) for first place in the National League West. The Dodgers dropped a 7-2 decision to Arizona Monday night at home.

COUGARS NATIONALLY RANKED IN WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL

The College of Charleston women's volleyball team is among the national leaders in wins and winning percentage. In the last 11 years, the Cougars are ranked eighth in win with 297 and eighth in winning percentage .798. The Cougars were Southern Conference champions from 2001–2009 and made NCAA appearances in 2002 and from 2005-2007. They made it to the SoCon title match last season, but lost to Samford in a three-game sweep.
