The Watauga High men's soccer team coughed up a late goal with five minutes left and settled for a 1-1 tie with West Caldwell Thursday night at Jack Groce Stadium. Collin Kreis-Potgieter scored WHS (6-1-1) only goal at the 50-minute mark of the second half. Logan Raichle picked up the assist on the play.

"I wanted to play a lot of kids tonight, especially with (Northwestern 3A/4A) conference beginning next (Monday)," said WHS coach Woody McKay. "Give them credit. The West Caldwell kids never stopped working, and they earned a goal late in the game."

The JV team defeated West Caldwell, 1-0. Nick Hellner scored off a corner kick by Austin Lubkemann. The Pioneers begin league play Monday at Fred T. Foard.
