"We didn't play our best tonight, but at least we won the game," said WHS coach Brittany Bolick.

Younger's goal came two minutes after Avery had taken a 3-2 lead. Tori Derrick scored the eventual game-winning goal from 18-yards away 11-minutes later. The goal was unassisted. Tristen Derrick added an insurance goal on a feed from Younger four minutes later. Tristen Derrick finished with a goal and an assist. Tonight's championship game begins at 7 p.m.

Fred T. Foard scored three times in the fifth inning and four more times in the sixth and defeated the Watauga High softball team 8-2 Thursday night in the Northwestern 3A/4A Conference opener for both teams in Newton, N.C.


