It took twelve men, two chainsaws and about an hour and a half- but the official White House Christmas tree came down just after 10:15 today.

The 20-foot-tree, donated by 2007 National Christmas Tree winner Joe Freeman at Mistletoe Meadows Farm in Ashe County, will soon start its trek to Washington D.C. where First Lady Laura Bush will receive it on November 26. Freeman plans to tour Washington D.C. this weekend- a welcome change from the stress of harvest season.

The tree is thirteen and a half feet wide- a difficult task for those assigned to bale the branches. A strong twine was used- but baling the tree wasn't the only complication, Freeman says.

It weighed almost 2,000 pounds and took several people to haul to the waiting truck.

It was an exciting event for spectators like 7-year-old Georgia Howell. She described the event in one word:

"Happy!"
