

Pioneers Pull Off Daily Double

The Watauga High boy's and girl's track teams swept the Northwestern 3A/4A Conference championships Thursday at Lenior-Rhyne University in Hickory, N.C. The WHS girls won five events and

bested the field with 174 points; the boys, led by Zach Styron, won three events and captured the title with 155.50 points.

Styron was a dual winner on Thursday as he captured both the boy's 110-meter hurdles (16.57 seconds) and the boy's 300-meter hurdles (42.94). The Pioneers also won the boy's 4x800 relay (8:11.50). WHS solidified the title by posting 34 top ten finishes.

Matt Hall turned in a second-place finish in the high jump (5-feet, 06-inches), Josh Anderson finished second in the 1,600 (4:37.39). He finished just six-tenths of a second behind the winner, Dylan Mathewson of South Caldwell (4:37.33).

Bryan Brackney turned in a strong effort and finished second in the 400 (50.66), and Ryan Hellenbrand finished second in the 800 (2:02.16). Hibriten finished a distant second with 103 points; St. Stephens finished third with 80 points.

The WHS girls won five events and posted 32 top-ten finishers. The Pioneers dominated the 1,600-meter run by capturing the top three spots in the race. Darby Middlebrook, who has slowly worked her way back into the line up following a leg injury last fall, won the event in 5:25.16. Doria Kosmala finished second in 5:27.22, Madison Harman finished third in 5:32.82. Kosmala won the 800 (2:24.66), Kathleen Mansure won the 3,200 (12:34.52), Taylor Drummonds won the pole vault (9-6), and WHS won the 4x800 relay (10:34.80).

Drummonds also posted a pair of second-place finishes in the 100-meter hurdles (15.65) and the 300 hurdles (49.39). Alison Seramur had a second-place finish in the pole vault (9-0), Middlebrook finished second in the 800 (2:25.56), and Lynde Wangler finished second in the 3,200 (12:42.31).

Alexander Central finished a distant second with 131 points; Fred T. Foard finished third with 68 points. The Pioneers will host the High Country Track & Field Classic next Saturday, May 4; the Class 4A Western Regional will be held at A.C. Reynolds High in Asheville, N.C., on Saturday, May 11.
