Appalachian State University field hockey was defeated 7-1 on Sunday afternoon by Penn at Ellen Vagelos Field. The Quakers were able to get on the board early, scoring one minute and 13 seconds into the match when a ball was played to the front of the goal and Elise Tilton was able to put it away.

Penn's Julie Tahan was able to score 15 minutes later off a rebounded shot to put the Quakers up 2-0. The Mountaineers responded a minute later off a penalty from Hanna French. Appalachian's Laura Malinoski found the net from the left side off an assist from Emily Knapp.

The Quakers would score once more before halftime from Tilton, finding a goal off a rebounded saved shot. Penn would continue to dominate in the second half, scoring four more times from Jasmine Cole, Emily Corcoran and Sunny Stirewalt to take the match from the Mountaineers 7-1.

Sebastien King also had an impressive performance with a 6-7(3), 6-1, 6-1 win over East Carolina's Mario Martinez, but eventually fell to Hunter Harrington of Clemson by a 6-2, 6-2 score.

In other singles action, Zach Bost was eliminated on the first round by a 6-0, 6-0 score to North Carolina's Nelson Vick while Matt Saltsgaver suffered a 6-2, 6-4 first-round loss to Clemson's Daniel Strawn.

App State's other doubles team of Mackenzie LaSure and Gabrielle Wreder automatically moved to the Round of 32 with a first-round bye, but were unable to overcome the Duke tandem of Marianne Jodoin and Alyssa Smith in an 8-1 loss.

In singles action, Cox dropped her first-round match in the main event draw to Ani Miao of Clemson by a score of 6-1, 6-3 while Armellino fell to East Carolina's Michelle Castro (6-0, 6-4) while Wreder was ousted by Campbell's Anna Ortiz (2-6, 6-1, 6-2).
