

### **No.11 Bears Belt Newberry On Senior Day**

The Lenoir-Rhyne Women's Soccer Team (11-3-1, 7-1-1) celebrated Senior Day in fine fashion with a 3-1 win over Newberry (8-7, 5-5) Saturday afternoon at the Moretz Sports - Athletic Complex.

L-R, ranked No. 11 in NCAA Division II and first in the Southeast Regional Poll, received two goals from senior forward Ariel Dominguez (Annapolis, Md.) and improved to 8-0 at home this year.

The Bears have also won 24 consecutive South Atlantic Conference Regular Season matches at home dating back to the 2009 season.

L-R sophomore midfielder Garcelle Alequine (Wilmington, Del.) opened the scoring with her team-leading eighth goal of the season in the 21st minute.

Alequine finished off a shot off the crossbar by sophomore midfielder Emmi Dunn (Reading, Pa.), who was credited with the assist.

Dominguez gave the Bears a 2-0 advantage at the 27:35 mark of the first half after heading in a shot which started on a corner kick. The play was double-assisted by sophomore defender Lizzie McNamara (Naples, Fla.) and junior defender Hanna Kiebel (Parker, Colo.).

Dominguez rounded out the scoring in the 55th minute while Newberry sandwiched a goal between Dominguez's two scores courtesy of Jessica Will (Leesville, S.C.).

Lenoir-Rhyne junior goalkeeper Genny Little (Fredericksburg, Va.) improved to 10-1 on the season after earning the victory. Little made a save for the Bears, who held a 28-4 advantage in shots taken in the win.

Newberry's Rebecca Darley (Wolcott, Conn.) suffered the loss in goal despite tallying nine saves on the afternoon. The Wolves were also handed their third consecutive loss.

Lenoir-Rhyne travels to Brevard, N.C., to take on Brevard on Wednesday in a league match beginning at 1:30 p.m. Newberry plays Limestone on the road Tuesday at 3:00 p.m.

Wood finished with 5K course in 18:47 while sophomore Grace Turner (Lincolnton, N.C.) was the Bears' top runner. Turner (20:00) finished 10th overall en route to All-SAC Second-Team honors

In the men's competition, Mars Hill won its 17th consecutive South Atlantic Conference Championship while Queens' Felix Duchampt was the overall winner. Duchampt ran the 8K course in 25:18.

For Lenoir-Rhyne, senior Aaron Nelson (Mayodan, N.C.) earned all-league second-team accolades for the second consecutive season after finishing 10th with a 26:20.

The Lenoir-Rhyne Men's and Women's Cross Country Teams will next compete in the NCAA Division II Southeast Regional Championship on Saturday, November 9, in Charlotte, N.C., at McAlpine Creek Park.

### **Lenoir-Rhyne Shuts Out Newberry, 1-0, On Men's Soccer Senior Day**

The Lenoir-Rhyne Men's Soccer Team (8-7-1, 3-5-1) prevailed in its final home match of the season, 1-0, over Newberry (1-14-1, 1-8-1) Saturday afternoon in a South Atlantic Conference contest on Senior Day at the Moretz Sports - Athletic Complex.

L-R junior midfielder Alex Mather (Nottingham, ENGLAND) scored the lone goal of the match as the Bears moved back over .500 for the season.

Mather connected at the 17:39 mark of the first half after heading in a free kick from freshman defender Josh Alderson (Formby, ENGLAND).

The goal was Mather's second of the season while Alderson was credited with the assist for Lenoir-Rhyne.

L-R held a 21-9 advantage in shots taken while senior Stefan Dill (Southampton, BERMUDA) earned the win in goal. The shutout was the fifth of the season for Dill, who also tallied four saves on the day.

Newberry's goalkeeper, Nicholas Lucido (Lakeland, Fla.), suffered the loss despite allowing just one goal while stopping seven shots. The Wolves are in the midst of an eight-match losing streak.

Lenoir-Rhyne hits the road to take on Brevard in a conference match on Wednesday in Brevard, N.C., beginning at 4:00 p.m. Newberry plays Limestone in Gaffney, S.C., on Wednesday at 3:00 p.m.
