

Bears Blasted By Davidson In Basketball Exhibition

The Lenoir-Rhyne Men's Basketball Team lost to Davidson by a 108-57 score on Sunday afternoon in an exhibition at the John M. Belk Arena.

Five players scored in double figures for the Wildcats, led by De'Mon Brooks (Charlotte, N.C.) with 21 points, in the win.

Davidson also hit 14 three-pointers on the day and held a 59-20 advantage at halftime en route to the victory.

Lenoir-Rhyne was led by senior center Matt Kunz (Kernersville, N.C.) with 15 points while junior guard Lawrence Miller (Gastonia, N.C.) added 10 points but the Bears hit just two-of-16 three-point attempts in the loss.

Tyler Kalinoski (Overland Park, Kan.) finished with 17 points and Chris Czerapowicz (Gothenburg, SWEDEN) added 15 points and 10 rebounds as well for Davidson, who opens with nationally-ranked Duke in Durham, N.C., this Friday at 7:00 p.m.
