

Rockets Soar Past WHS, 7-1

The woes continued on Saturday for the Watauga High baseball team. The Pioneers (4-5), who have lost four of their last five games, lost to A.C. Reynolds 7-1 in a non-conference game at Pioneers Field.

The Rockets (4-3-1), who have won three in a row (they've only given up one run during that stretch), also won their first game in Boone since 2007. Their top two hitters, Cory Watt and Jon Merrill, who was also the winning pitcher on Saturday, did most of the damage.

Those two produced six hits, including three doubles, two walks, two stolen bases, and five runs-batted-in. Individually, Merrill was 3-5 with a pair of doubles and four RBI; Watt was 3-3 with a double, two stolen bases, he scored three times, he drove in a run, and he walked twice.

"Jon made me look like a genius," said ACR coach Brian Craig. "He was batting seventh, but I decided to move him up in the order. Those guys really gave us a great one-two punch up there."

The Rockets jumped on top for good with three runs in the third. An error, a sacrifice bunt, a single by Watt, and a two-run single by Merrill gave ACR a 2-1 lead.

The Rockets took control of the game with two more runs in the fourth. Watt and Merrill highlighted that rally with consecutive run-scoring doubles. And Merrill made it stand up as he tossed a complete game.

The right hander scattered six hits and struck out six. The only run he gave up came in the first inning.

Jesse Illich led off the game with an infield single. He stole second base, moved to third on a ground ball by Carson Isaacs, and he scored on a wild pitch. That gave WHS a 1-0 lead, and losing pitcher Jeffrey Gainey (0-1), who was making his first start of the season, made it stand up until the third.

Gainey was finally knocked out of the game with two outs in the fourth. He coughed up five earned runs on six hits in 3.2 innings. He also hit three batters. And the WHS pitching staff handed out five walks hit four batters on Saturday. The Pioneers have given up 18 walks in their last three games.
