The Rollins Women's Lacrosse Team (6-2), ranked No. 9 in NCAA Division II, defeated Lenoir-Rhyne (6-4), 17-10, Wednesday afternoon at Moretz Stadium. The Tars' Caroline Lamere (Longwood, Fla.) finished with a match-high four goals to go along with two assists as Rollins used a late sure to beat Lenoir-Rhyne.

L-R freshman attacker Torrey Schwitkis (San Diego, Calif.) and senior midfielder Hayley Beattie (Lebanon, N.J.) both scored twice despite the loss.

Rollins held an 11-9 edge after a free position goal by Lenoir-Rhyne junior midfielder Lauren Donovan (Hollywood, Md.) with 20:07 remaining in the second half but the Tars responded by scoring six of the last seven goals of the match.

Tyler Thomas (Winter Park, Fla.) also scored three times for Rollins while Elyse De Lisle (Windermere, Fla.) earned the win in goal. De Lisle finished with 12 saves.

Lenoir-Rhyne senior goalkeeper Amanda Cotto (Fort Myers, Fla.) took the loss despite totaling eight saves. Rollins held the edge in both shots taken (36-30) and ground balls (24-21) in the victory.
